ASSOCIATE HYDROGEOLOGIST**

United Water Conservation District seeks to hire an Associate Hydrogeologist with a strong working knowledge of local hydrogeology and water resource management activities. The desired candidate must be organized, proactive, self-motivated, and responsive, with the ability to work both independently and with others. Under general direction, the Associate Hydrogeologist performs a variety of duties involving data acquisition and management, data interpretation and analysis, design and execution of special studies, report writing, and other tasking in support of Groundwater Department activities. The qualified applicant must have strong written and verbal communication skills, with demonstrated ability to prepare well-written reports and documents, conduct effective presentations, frequently interact with regulatory agencies, and have the ability to plan and assist in managing projects. Some field work may be required. Previous experience with Geographic Information Systems (GIS), groundwater flow modeling, well construction, geochemistry, water resource management (including SGMA) and knowledge of California water quality regulations is desired. Must be proficient with the Microsoft Office software, including Access. The preferred candidate has demonstrated ability to interact effectively with consultants, regulators, and the public, and will be expected to mentor junior staff and work closely with United's Groundwater, Engineering and Environmental Planning and Conservation Departments.

The position requires a Bachelor of Science (BS) degree in Geology or Hydrology from a four-year college or university. A minimum of five years of experience as a geologist or hydrologist is required, with a minimum of four years' experience in hydrogeology. Registration as a Professional Geologist (PG) in CA or registered as a Professional Hydrogeologist, or Professional Hydrologist-Groundwater, through the American Institute of Hydrology. A Master of Science degree is highly desirable. Possession of a valid California Driver's License by time of appointment is necessary.

United Water Conservation District is a special district that was founded in 1927. The District is responsible for the conservation and enhancement of the water resources of the Santa Clara River Valley and the Oxnard coastal plain in southern Ventura County. District facilities include Santa Felicia Dam and Lake Piru, the Freeman Diversion, groundwater recharge basins, well fields, water treatment facilities and major water transmission pipelines. The District offers a competitive package of benefits, including a defined-benefit retirement plan (PERS). The salary range for this position is \$99,380 - \$120,804 per year.
